ACTING 1 (7th-12th)

Day(s)/Time: Mondays - 2:00-2:55

Teacher: Kortney Scott

Tuition: \$170.00 per year

Supply fee: \$60.00 per year - Covers printing, supplies for props, printed headshot, makeup and costume pieces.

This will be a highly interactive and hands-on class, perfect for students wanting to break into acting!

The first semester, students will learn the basics of all things related to performing, such as how to audition, how to be confident on stage, acting techniques, stage directions, and much more! The second semester, students will work on preparing for auditions as well as writing and performing their own show as a class for finale night. Students will leave this class with a headshot, resume and be confident in their monologue in order to audition for the production the following semester if they choose to.

This class will perform at finale night in both the Fall and Spring which will allow students to take what they have been learning and apply it on stage. Dates and times for those productions can be found on the DE calendar. Participation in the Spring Finale Night (whether on stage or behind the scenes) will be required for a final grade.

Homework: Consists of memorizing lines, preparing scenes, and going over scripts

ACTING 2 (7th-12th) (audition only)

Tuition: \$340.00 per year

Supply fee: \$100 per year - covers a show t-shirt, script and costume pieces

This class will be working on a full-length show to perform in April 2024. We will have class on Mondays and Thursdays, for an hour each day. Being cast in the show is required before registration is allowed into this class, so auditions and cast lists are released prior to registration.

Scripts will be available to the cast for pick up in June. This allows students time to memorize lines prior to the first class rehearsal.

Memorization and following stage directions will be required. Production day will be at the end of the Spring semester, and the dates and times of those can be found on the DE calendar. Tickets will be sold for each show and families will be sent that information as soon as it becomes available.

Our 2023-2024 Spring Production is “The Boxcar Children”.

Prerequisite: The completion of Acting One or a resume that reflects theater experience

ADVANCED BIOLOGY - A&P (11th-12th)

1.5 hour class. Two semester course covering the anatomy and physiology of the human body.

Homework: 4-5 hours per week including reading, note-taking, some at-home lab work, lab reports (only modules with dissections), scientific journal research, study questions, test preparation, and some take-home tests.

Parents are responsible for oversight of students' work and grading all work except for lab reports, tests, and journal research.

Prerequisite: Chemistry

This class is for 11th-12th graders only.

ADVANCED MATH (10th-12th)

1.5 hour class. A two semester course covering trigonometry, logarithms, analytical geometry, logic, statistics and upper-level algebraic concepts. Students will also become proficient at using

a graphing calculator. Algebra 1, Algebra 2 and Advanced Math are four math credits that include geometry.

Homework: 4-5 hr/wk generally consisting of approximately 50 to 60 problems twice a week and a take-home test or graphing calculator assignment.

Parents are responsible for overseeing homework completion, grading & corrections, as well as administering take home tests.

Prerequisite: 70% at preceding math level.

ALGEBRA 1/2 (7th-9th)

1.5 hour class. Two semester course introducing algebraic concepts and continuing to strengthen general math skills. As time permits, tutorial/homework help will be provided in class. There will be about 2-3 hours of homework a week; 20 to 30 problems per lesson twice a week, plus 3 to 4 take at home tests per semester. Quizzes/tests will be given in class on Thursdays

Homework: Parents will oversee homework, grading, correcting, recording, and administer the home tests.

Prerequisite: 70% at preceding math level.

This class provides an overview of basic American Sign Language vocabulary, structure, grammar, and some Deaf culture, and introduction to Deaf education. Students will master fingerspelling, numbers, colors, food, animals, sentence structure, and facial/body movements. Additionally, students will be introduced to ASL storytelling and a simple overview of functions of the ear and how it works.

This class provides a gentle introduction to essay writing while using the same style and technique as our upper elementary essay class. Students will be using the “Institute For Excellence in Writing” curriculum to master “key word outlines” and paragraph writing. They will learn to write short essays in a structured format while including “dress ups” to make their writing more interesting. Our topics this year will be People and Places in our Community! This class is ideal for students who have not taken a formal writing class and will lay a foundation before entering the upper elementary essay class.

Homework: (One hour per week) Students will be working on their essays at home. Parental oversight and involvement is expected for weekly homework assignments. Parents are expected to edit written work (for spelling and basic grammar errors) prior to a student turning an assignment in.

BEGINNING US HISTORY (2nd-4th)

This new history class will teach young learners the basics of US History. We will start with Columbus and learn about different people and events that helped to shape our nation’s history. We will also incorporate some civics components into this class. Students will do more hands-on learning in class and homework will largely be reading from our textbook. Memorization will be a key component of class. Lastly, students will complete one project per semester. Please note that the textbook for this class is on a third-grade reading level. So, some younger students may need a parent’s help to complete the reading at home.

BIOLOGY (9th-12th) **Two sections offered!**

This foundational course is designed to be the student's first high school science course. It is a college-prep biology course that provides a detailed introduction to the methods and concepts of general biology. In this class, your student will:

- * See the evidence of God's creation as they learn scientific principles
 - * Conduct experiments in a methodical way that prepares them not just for future classes, but for life
 - *Take personal notes, conduct and record experiments, and be able to interpret results
 - *Develop skills to think through and beyond the textbook materials, and be able to create their own experiments from concept to interpretation of results
- *Further develop skills in their own learning style and how they best process, record, study, and retain information learned

Homework: 3-4 hr/wk consisting of independent reading, some lab work, study questions and tests. Occasionally some labs will need to be done at home. Supplies necessary should be things that students can find around the house or purchased from Walmart at a very reasonable price (example eggs, vinegar etc).

Parents are a vital part of this course and are responsible for overseeing completion of work and grading all assignments other than labs and exams.

Calling all bookworms!

In this class we will rotate age appropriate children's literature on a 3 year rotating schedule so nothing is repeated.

Talking about books helps develop or deepen a love of reading! We will read together in class each day and have a lively discussion about what we read. We will practice different styles of note taking while reading that help us stay focused and identify characters and plot.

This year we will cover *The Lion The Witch and the Wardrobe* by CS Lewis in the fall semester while learning the Biblical parallels in the book using, *A Family Guide To Narnia: Biblical Truths in C.S. Lewis's The Chronicles of Narnia* by Christin Ditchfield.

In the spring semester, we will read *The Boxcar Children* (this is the Spring DE Theater production) and *Charlotte's Web*.

BOSS 2.0 - (Brain Optimization Support & Strategies) (4th - 6th & 7th-9th)

This is a class that focuses on character development, your thought life, social skills, executive functioning skills, reflex integration, and has a sensori-motor movement-based approach for brain-activating exercises and activities.

These techniques can also help address ADHD-like issues, with a comprehensive approach focusing on a “top-down approach” with executive functioning skills, social skills and character development training, and a “bottom-up approach” with the reflex integration exercises and sensori-motor activities working on strengthening the brain-body connection.

This class provides many tools for families to use and implement at home, since that is truly where the change will occur! This class will have weekly homework consisting of exercises, reflex integration movement patterns, and executive functioning activities.

Homework: The homework should only take 10-15 min per day. Please only consider taking this class if you are committed to doing the homework process to see the benefits of this BOSS 2.0 approach!

Do you have a child who could benefit from a year of strengthening their math skills between Saxon Math 3 and Saxon 5/4? Are you new to DE or Saxon and want to ensure success in Math 5/4? I have used Saxon to teach Math 3 and Math 5/4 for multiple years. This class helps children in the examples above and serves as a bridge between the two Saxon levels. We will slowly transition from working all problems on a worksheet to working out of a book. The students will spend the year strengthening weaknesses, mastering basic addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division facts, and building on concepts taught in Math 3. The class structure will mirror Math 3 and Math 5/4 covering multiple lessons each week with an assessment about every five lessons. This is a teacher created course and not associated with Saxon Math.
